Subtle changes in crown designs have been prevalent since the crown was invented. Often a muntafacturer would use a different fost, omst or add a detail, or change the bus of brightness, ladeed many crowns are different only by skirt legend or for that matter by manufacturer's brand. One might assume the Cobbers and Cohns brands were separate at one time as evidenced by their brand-name-only crowns at each end of row one. I speculate that Cohns purchased Cobbers and hence the three Cohns with Cobbers sub-heading in row one.

I especially enjoy dated crown as they exhibit a style used in a certain period, provide good reference, and give a crown more tuneing to me. In row two, crown one dates itself: "Established in 1857" and "100 Yean" dates this crown as 1957. In now four, two more crowns her addes, only these are quite explicit, referring to Best of Show awards for 1964 and 1965. (Reminds me of Pabst Blue, Rebben Beer, Does anyone remember the old jingle from the Pabst commercials in the 60°55." "Pabst won the ribbon in 1893 and now its here..." but of the commercials in the following the server..."

Can anyone explain why the crowns marked "Flip Top Resealer" are not Flip Top Re-Sealers? I have seen several non-U.S, crowns of other brands printed as such.

I particularly like the variety of products offered under this brand. How about the flavors Rod Liue, Gene Liue, Cancel Cup and ZCAIT fill like to laste those — I bink. Notice how some are marked "brewed", such as the Ginger Beer crown in row three and the 6 O'Cleck Lager and 6 O'Cleck. Stout crowns in row free. Was the Ginger Beer brewed, but non-alcohale? Were the Lager and the Stout true beer? The Tomout Juice in row as is likely mether earbenated or brewed, but a pixe. Pine Quench and Clara Cope they might be produced under a different description such as a space beer, fruit punk, fruit cup and sursaparills. All in all, I find this brand interesting and enjoyable and hope you do. too.
